This has been another productive year for the Literacy Coalition as we carry out our mission to provide leadership to advance literacy, life-long learning, and essential skills for all New Brunswickers through partnerships and collaboration with others.

In January we were thrilled to receive approval for our exciting new project entitled Talking, Singing, Reading...Everyone, Everywhere!". With this project, we are working with the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development (EECD) to provide in depth literacy training to early childhood educators across the province who are becoming early literacy mentors for other educators in their facility. The Literacy Coalition has been awarded a \$1.26 million grant from the Waltons Trust Foundation to partner with EECD in implementing this impactful project.

We were also pleased to receive a grant from the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development allowing us to translate our "Let's Learn!" booklets in Arabic and Ukrainian. We are now offering this valuable resource in those languages as well as both official languages and our Indigenous languages.

We continue to recognize and celebrate literacy programs and individuals with the Dr. Marilyn Trenholme Counsell Awards. In June we held our well attended Dr. Marilyn Trenholme Counsell Literacy Awards ceremony at Government House in Fredericton, where we celebrated six outstanding award recipients from across the province who have made significant contributions to literacy.

Our major fund raiser, the Literacy Gala Dinner and Auction will take place on May 6<sup>th</sup>, 2025, at the Delta Mariott Hotel in Fredericton. We are looking forward to once again celebrating the amazing work of our Literacy Champions and shining a much-deserved spotlight on incredible adult learners. Stay tuned for more details coming soon.

As an organization, we continue to support families, children, and adult learners across the province. Over the past year, these have included our annual Adult Learner's Writing Contest, book donations, celebration of Family literacy Day, and International Book Giving Day and distribution of our "Let's Learn!" literacy booklets for parents of young children. We continue to maintain our Referral Service – Free Learn Line and our Essential Skills website to share

Through our meetings, newsletters, and social media, we share knowledge, information and best practices about literacy which result in more effective delivery of programs.

LCNB is proud to continue our work with the Literacy Champions Network, formed as a result of the shared passion of the twelve literacy organizations previously affiliated with <a href="the-Peter Gzowski">the Peter Gzowski</a>
<a href="Foundation for Literacy">Foundation for Literacy</a>. We once again participated in an inspiring social media campaign in September leading up to Internation Literacy Day, where we highlighted the amazing work done by organizations from coast to coast.

Our Executive Director has submitted several promising proposals for projects to benefit early childhood, family, youth and adult literacy in New Brunswick. We look forward to meeting with the new government Ministers to discuss potential partnerships and to receiving a positive response from these proposals in the new year.

# **Projects**

## Talking, Singing, Reading...Everyone, Everywhere!

In January of 2024, LCNB received approval for a new 4-year project: "Talking, Singing, Reading Everyone, Everywhere!". The Literacy Coalition was thrilled to receive a grant of \$1.26 million from Walton's Trust Foundation over 4 years to work in collaboration with the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development (EECD) to carry out this project. Working in partnership with EECD, we are providing in depth literacy training to early childhood educators across the province who are becoming early literacy mentors for other educators in their facilities. This project will see 400 early childhood educators trained across the province over the next 4 years. It will enhance their skills, abilities and confidence in Storytelling, Singing and Reading Aloud. These early literacy practices are foundational for setting children on a trajectory to become confident readers by the time they reach third grade, which is an important milestone on the pathway toward success in school and life.

In the first year, educators will participate in 2-day components in Saint John, Fredericton, Miramichi, and Moncton. The first component on Storytelling is led by Joanne LeBlanc-Haley. These sessions explore the theory and resulting practices centering on oral language development through storytelling and related arts.

The second component on "Reading Aloud" is led by Dr. Sherry Rose and Dr. Kim Stewart.

### Let's Learn Arabic and Ukrainian Translations



# SOCIAL MEDIA IMPACT REPORT


## Facebook

#### **Follows**



The above graph shows the rate of new followers on our Facebook page over the last fiscal year. Facebook no longer shows the exact number of followers; however, we have an estimated **2,151** followers as of now, which is an increase of **165** from April 2023. The spike on the above graph around February can be attributed to the Family Literacy Day giveaway we ran in late January.

#### Reach




Based on the data above, reach and content interaction have grown significantly positively in the past fiscal year. We can expect to have a similar reach in the next year, meeting or crossing the approximate 37,000 reach we had in the past year.

Note the three spikes in the graph above, from left to right:

- October 11, 25<sup>th</sup>, Dr. Marilyn Trenholme Counsell Literacy Awards success post: Reach of 4,935 and 73 likes.
- February 14<sup>th</sup>, International Book Giving Day (book donation to Boys & Girls Club): Reach of **3,400** and **8 likes.**
- March 19th, GED replacement information: Reach of **4,400 and 8 likes.**

#### **Visits**



From April 1 to March 2023, our Facebook page was viewed by **3,841** unique users. We're on track to surpass this for next year—with every quarter garnering over **1,500** views. The spikes in January can be attributed to our Family Literacy Day giveaway. The spikes in February and March were because of the peaks in reach with the GED and International Book Giving Day posts.

## Twitter (X)

Analytics on Twitter (X) remains unhelpful for non-Premium Accounts. It seems to have stopped showing even the 3 months' impression data like older quarterly communications reports. Only X Premium subscribers have access to Twitter analytics tools now. However, we are able to see impressions (times a post was seen on the platform) and engagements (user interactions on a post) for individual posts. Going through the post impressions manually, we have average impressions of 27-30.

#### Newsletter

From April 2023 to March 2024, we ran 4 newsletters.

Our newsletter continues to perform well overall. The May-June 2023 had an open rate of **34.4%**, with a click rate of **3.9%**. The July-August newsletter had an open rate of **36.9%** with a click rate of **5.7%**. The Nov-Dec 2023 newsletter had an open rate of **28.3%** with a click rate of **4.3%**. The Jan- Feb 2024 newsletter had an open rate of **29.2%** with a click rate of **3.9%**. These numbers are roughly on par with previous newsletters in terms of clicks and open rates.

We currently have **467** subscribers, which is a drop from the approximately 550 subscribers we had. This comes as a result of the purge we did for inactive recipients.

## Website



From April 2023 to March 2024, our website has had **8,005** views. The most popular page is the Home page, which had 1,952 views. This rate of traffic is very similar to that of quarterly reports, with every four months having approximately 2,000 views. 86.5% of views come from Canada followed by 8.2% from the USA.
